Dear Mr. Navaratte,

Please inform the Court that Appellant intends to focus during the 30 minutes requested on the following penalty phase claims of error which are related in that each relates to the jury being improperly misled concerning mental disorders and volitional impairment:

- IV The People committed prejudicial error by presenting evidence and theories regarding volitional impairment inconsistent with those presented by the People in civil commitment cases in violation of the Due Process Clause.
- V The prosecutor committed prejudicial misconduct by failing to correct testimony which it should have known was false or misleading and exploited the false impression left by the testimony of Dr. Park Dietz in violation of Due Process.
- VI The court improperly excluded all evidence regarding SVP proceedings, thereby excluding relevant mitigating evidence of volitional impairment and institutional failure, in violation of the Eighth Amendment.
- VII The exclusion of all reference to SVP cases violated the appellant's right to full and fair cross-examination under the Sixth Amendment.
- VIII The death penalty is excessive under the Eighth Amendment for persons like Krebs whose moral culpability is reduced by the existence of a mental disorder which reduces their volitional control to the degree that they are subject to lawful civil

preventative detention

IX The jury was prevented from considering the impairment of control due to mental

disease or defect under section 190.3 (h) by the failure to give proper instruction in light

of the State's expert testimony, requiring reversal

In addition, Appellant will focus on the following guilt phase issue:

II Krebs' videotaped confessions should have been excluded because Hobson

failed to scrupulously honor Krebs' invocation of rights and deliberately used "question

first," warn later, and other techniques inconsistent with a free and voluntary waiver of

his Miranda rights
