## Summary of Cases Accepted and Related Actions During Week of June 20, 2023

[This news release is issued to inform the public and the press of cases that the Supreme Court has accepted and of their general subject matter. The statement of the issue or issues in each case set out below does not necessarily reflect the view of the court, or define the specific issues that will be addressed by the court.]

#23-126 *People v. Chagolla*, S279679. (D079231; nonpublished opinion; Riverside County Superior Court; BAF1700629.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed in part and reversed in part a judgment of conviction of criminal offenses and remanded for further proceedings. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in *People v. Rojas*, S275835 (#22-276), which presents the following issue: Does Assembly Bill No. 333 (Stats. 2021, ch. 699) unconstitutionally amend Proposition 21, if applied to the gang-murder special circumstance (Pen. Code, § 190.2, subd. (a)(22))?

#23-127 *People v. Mendez*, \$279762. (B318512; nonpublished opinion; Los Angeles County Superior Court; KA004460.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed an order denying a post-judgment motion in a criminal matter. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in *People v. Reyes*, \$270723 (#21-509), which presents the following issues: (1) Does substantial evidence support the conclusion that petitioner acted with implied malice? (2) Does substantial evidence support the conclusion that petitioner's actions constituted murder or aided and abetted murder?

*People v. Rodriguez*, S052210. The court granted appellant's application for a stay in this automatic appeal and ordered a limited remand to the superior court for consideration of a petition for resentencing pursuant to Penal Code section 1172.6.

The court's primary role is to decide matters of statewide importance and to maintain uniformity in the law throughout California by reviewing matters from the six districts of the California Courts of Appeal and the fifty-eight county superior courts (the trial courts). Among its other duties, the court also decides all capital appeals and related matters and reviews both attorney and judicial disciplinary matters.
