## Summary of Cases Accepted and Related Actions During Week of June 24, 2024

*[This news release is issued to inform the public and the press of cases that the Supreme Court has accepted and of their general subject matter. The statement of the issue or issues in each case set out below does not necessarily reflect the view of the court, or define the specific issues that will be addressed by the court.]*

**#24-115 *People v. Aleo*, S284938.** (F084511; nonpublished opinion; Stanislaus County Superior Court; CR-19-002757.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed an order denying a post-judgment motion in a criminal matter.

**#24-116 *People v. Quijada*, S284780.** (B318184; nonpublished opinion; Los Angeles County Superior Court; KA013919.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed an order denying a post-judgment motion in a criminal matter.

The court ordered briefing in *Aleo* and *Quijada* deferred pending decision in *People v. Emanuel*, S280551 (#23-174), which presents the following issue: Does sufficient evidence support the trial court's finding that defendant acted with reckless indifference to human life and therefore was ineligible for resentencing pursuant to Penal Code section 1172.6?

**#24-117 *People v. Bribiesca*, S285112.** (C098323; nonpublished opinion; Mono County Superior Court; MFE08008678.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed an order denying a post-judgment motion in a criminal matter.

**#24-118 *People v. Sibomana*, S284866.** (B324810; nonpublished opinion; Los Angeles County Superior Court; LA092131.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed an order denying a post-judgment motion in a criminal matter.

The court ordered briefing in *Bribiesca* and *Sibomana* deferred pending decision in *In re Hernandez*, S282186 (#23-261), which presents the following issue: Does the totality of the circumstances establish that defendant meaningfully understood the immigration consequences of her plea?
