## Summary of Cases Accepted and Related Actions During Week of December 27, 2021

*[This news release is issued to inform the public and the press of cases that the Supreme Court has accepted and of their general subject matter. The statement of the issue or issues in each case set out below does not necessarily reflect the view of the court, or define the specific issues that will be addressed by the court.]*

**#21-572 *Guardianship of S.H.R., S271265.*** (B308440; 68 Cal.App.5th 563, mod. 69 Cal.App.5th 85a; Los Angeles County Superior Court; 19AVPB00310.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed orders in a guardianship proceeding. This case presents issues relating to petitions for Special Immigrant Findings under Code of Civil Procedure section 155.

**#21-573 *People v. Bradt, S271949.*** (A158999; nonpublished opinion; Sonoma County Superior Court; SCR6970881.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed a judgment of conviction of criminal offenses. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in *People v. Hendrix*, S265668 (#21-21), which includes the following issue: Does the standard of *People v. Watson* (1956) 46 Cal.2d 818 or the standard of *Chapman v. California* (1967) 368 U.S. 818 apply to error in instructing on the defense of mistake of fact?

**#21-574 *People v. Jackson, S271432.*** (F081570; nonpublished opinion; Fresno County Superior Court; CF92472108.) Petition for review after the Court of Appeal affirmed an order denying a post-judgment motion in a criminal matter. The court ordered briefing deferred pending decision in *People v. Strong*, S266606 (#21-101), which presents the following issue: Does a felony-murder special circumstance finding (Pen. Code, § 190.2, subd. (a)(17)) made before *People v. Banks* (2015) 61 Cal.4th 788 and *People v. Clark* (2016) 63 Cal.4th 522 preclude a defendant from making a prima facie showing of eligibility for relief under Penal Code section 1170.95?
